“Roll up the rim for Trudeau”

News that Tim Hortons app has raised serious concerns with the Privacy Commissioner for using location tracking technology on anyone who downloads their APP to track where they live, work, and visits to competitors, without informed consent, begs the question, “Who else is taking your personal information, and for what reason?”

Big government surveillance is on a collision course with democracy. Largely unregulated in Canada, digital tracking offers an Orwellian dystopian future that captures and records every aspect of the human experience for the benefit of surveillance Liberals. The announcement by the federal government of its national contact tracing application (app) to be installed on personal electronic devices, such as cell phones will be voluntary, should be taken with a grain of salt.

While in making the announcement, Trudeau chose to lie to Canadians. He was quoted in the media, during his morning cameo appearance as saying, the “privacy commissioner has been worked with on this app.” When asked, the Privacy Commissioner immediately issued a denial, effectively exposing Trudeau as a liar.

By shutting down Parliament, the Liberal Party avoids the questions, “what is the government hiding and why will it not provide the Privacy Commissioner of Canada the government app?” Let the Commissioner, as an independent officer of Parliament, determine if the government’s digital contact tracing that involves the collection, use and disclosure of Canadians’ personal information contravenes federal privacy laws.

Even while two Canadians are falsely imprisoned in China for being in the wrong place at the wrong time, the Liberal party refuses to stand up to the Chinese Communist Party, and ban state-controlled Chinese company Huawei from building controversial 5G mobile networks in Canada.

Privacy protection only receives lip service from the current federal government. Big government surveillance socialists are exploiting the COVID-19 pandemic in all their pride and glory.

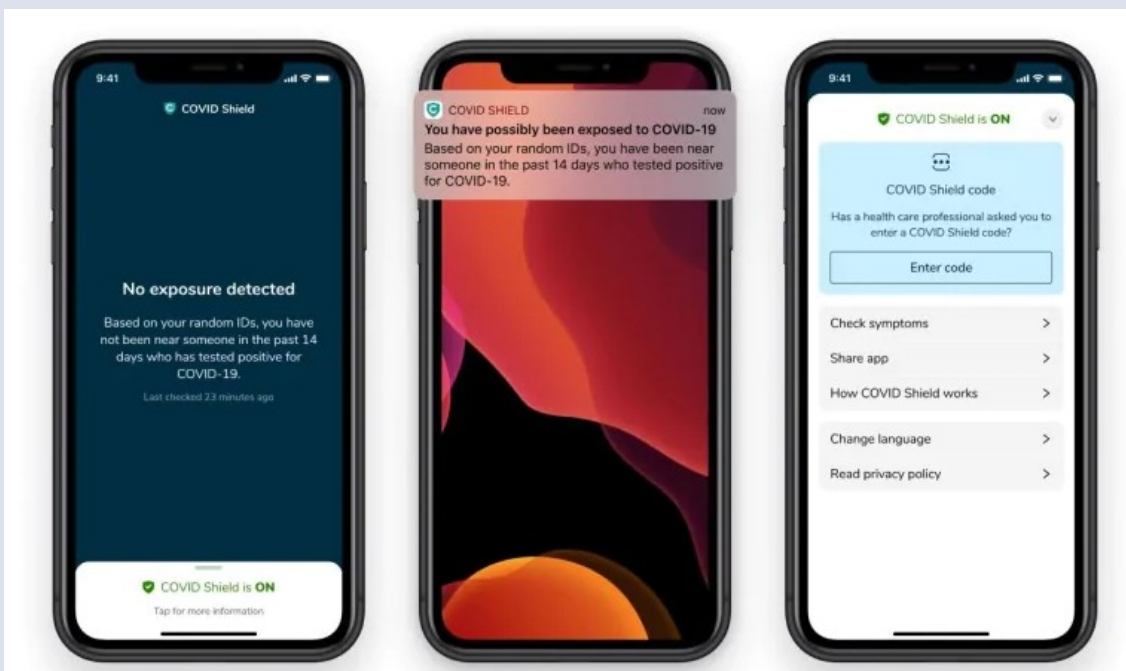
The technology to gather information from trusting Canadians is being exploited.

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Dear Constituent,

As your Federal Member of Parliament, I am pleased to acknowledge the tremendous efforts of the people of Renfrew-Nipissing-Pembroke in keeping the COVID-19 virus at bay.

So far, at the time of writing, there has been one local death attributed to the virus. Of the few cases registered, they were brought into our area, which is the real threat to rural areas such as ours.

I am particularly encouraged by the leadership demonstrated by our Provincial Government in responding to an unprecedented situation with extraordinary measures.

Whether a province would be helped or blocked assisting residents affected by COVID-19, depended on the opening of Parliament. Federal financial assistance has become conditional on adopting the bad policies, such as higher payroll deductions for employees and employers. This has the perverse effect of making it even harder for small businesses to re-start after the COVID -19 shutdown and bringing their workers back. One thing for certain, many employers, who were forced to close their doors due to the virus pandemic, will not be re-opening.

As your Member of Parliament, I am pleased to support measures to help people financially cope with the closures. When the federal government adopted my recommendation regarding the Regional Relief and Recovery Fund to assist small and medium-sized businesses that had “fallen through the cracks” of existing programs, support was there. More importantly, it was my recommendation for this program to be delivered locally through the Renfrew County Community Futures Development Corporation and credit unions that merited that support.

I continue to press the government to lift restrictions on new entrepreneurs, who started or took over businesses in 2020, and those who use personal bank accounts to pay the bills.

Veterans awaiting benefits, victims of the Phoenix Pay system, and seniors struggling to make ends meet are still among those we try to get the government to take action on every day.

FIREARMS AND PROPERTY RIGHTS

The decision by the Liberal Government to use the distraction of the pandemic to confiscate shotguns and hunting rifles from law-abiding firearms owners has made each of them a COVID-19 victim without contracting the virus.

Do not be fooled by terms like “assault-style,” which has no legal definition in Canada, or “military-style,” which is a made-up phrase used by the Liberals, and does not exist in the *Firearms Act*. Those phrases are used to confuse and scare people who are unfamiliar with firearms, that fake definitions justify confiscation. Similarly the recent tragic incident in Nova Scotia was used to confuse Canadians.

Neighbours of the psychopathic Nova Scotia killer had been warning the RCMP for years the killer was dangerous. Dressed as a fake policeman, driving a fake police car, he committed his horrendous crimes with unlicensed firearms. He did not have a licence to own a firearm. The illegal collection had been reported to the police, who did not act.

Banning legally owned firearms has no effect on illegally owned firearms.

The facts did not prevent the Liberal Government from using this tragedy. Claiming the opposite when it announced its plan to confiscate private property.

The good news is Canadians are fighting back! The Ontario Landowners Association, (which includes our local Renfrew-Nipissing-Pembroke County Chapter) has served Notice to the federal government that it will challenge the confiscation of the private property of individuals in court.

“We view this as not a firearms issue specifically, but as a direct attack on the lawful ownership of Private Property. The removal of lawfully purchased Private Property without compensation and the removal of hunting and sport shooting established over hundreds of years as part of our culture and heritage.” Jeff D. Bogaerts, President Ontario Landowners Association

They will be joined in court by members of the Canadian Coalition for Firearm Rights, who have included a constitutional challenge in their legal brief. Other groups and individuals are involved in challenges as well.

The confiscation announcement was made with no consultation among all elected MPs, individuals, businesses, or groups such as farmers, gun clubs and sporting leagues.

As your elected voice, I have been prevented from debating this undemocratic matter in Parliament, with Parliament being shut down. More importantly, YOU have been denied your right, to know, to question and to voice YOUR opinion on the government plan to confiscate YOUR private property.

Just as we fought the long-gun registry successfully, we will fight this latest effort to take away our rights.

RECOVERY PLAN MISSING

The subsequent decision by the Liberal Government to play politics with this fund and funnel money intended for rural Ontario into downtown Toronto and Montreal is another reason why Trudeau must be held accountable in Parliament.

In Renfrew-Nipissing-Pembroke, people who contact my office tell me they are afraid, but not of catching the virus.

They are worried about having no job to return to.

They are concerned about losing their homes.

Family businesses, which were already stressed by more government regulation and the carbon tax hike, are now faced with the prospect of having to permanently close their doors.

It is called being a COVID-19 victim without contracting the virus.

Farmers, who were told by the federal agriculture Minister the April 1st carbon tax increase would “only” cost them 8 or 9 hundred extra dollars in taxes, were deliberately misled.

Some Ontario grain farmers have actual carbon tax bills of 8 to 9 THOUSAND dollars. These extra costs are being passed onto consumers when grain products such as flour eventually showed up on grocery store shelves.

In the absence of a federal budget, and a plan to kick-start the economy, the public has lost confidence in what little may have extended our country as we faced an unprecedented situation.

Canadians know the longer the federal government keeps restrictions in place, the worse the recession will be.

Pandemic fatigue

Constituents, who contact me say they are tired being told to wash their hands, waiting in line, and following arrows in the grocery store. People in Renfrew County have done a good job. We have avoided the brunt of cases. However, it should be recognized there are limits to everyone’s willingness to put their lives on hold.

As we slowly move to re-open our economy, now is the time to take stock of where we have been, and where we are headed as a society.

Was the slow response to closing our borders intentional or incompetence?

The decision by the federal government to avoid democratic accountability by shutting down our principle democratic institution, Parliament, has been the greatest cost, apart from the billions and billions added to the national debt.

Trudeau believes his doorstep appearance every morning, parroted later by fawning

cabinet ministers, together with a bought and tax-paid national media, is somehow a substitute for parliamentary accountability.

The truth is no government has unleashed so much spending with such cursory accountability, particularly when it is piling on debt which will take generations to reduce.

What is the federal government hiding when it refuses a funding request from the Auditor General to better probe the merits of all those pandemic-coping programs?

Finally releasing a budget on this massive spending spree was a valid request of Canadians, one shrugged off by a finance minister who says forecasting is too hard.

Using the pandemic to seize private property, and add carbon taxes to fuel, is not helpful.

It is clear, as long leadership in Ottawa is absent, Canada will be in worse shape than when we entered the crisis with a withering economy.

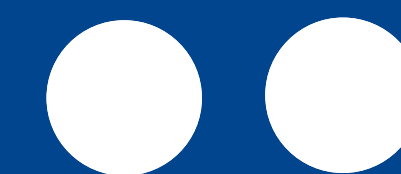


Meeting with Renfrew County Paramedics prior to the lockdowns.
